When I came there, I was -- I 18 was looking for a place to stay at, and he said he had a 19 place that I can stay at. That's why I was staying 20 there. 21 DEPUTY JONES: Good Lord was looking after you. 22 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Uh-huh. 23 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. Yeah. I only -- I only did --2.4 work in different places, back and forth, back and 25 forth, back and forth, all up in Missouri and Kansas

City and all -- all over the place, Indiana, packing 1 2 watermelons all over the place. That's the type of work I was doing. 3 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Did you see anything in the 4 newspaper about this right after the murders at all? 5 6 Did you see anything in the paper? 7 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, there was something in the paper 8 about this Jamaican. They said he was there. He was at the man's house. I never did see not -- see no truck 9 10 there. I never seen nobody, but they say he was there. 11 He supposed to been. 12 DEPUTY JONES: When you went to Zeigler's house? 13 (Multiple people speaking at once.) 14 MR. THOMAS: Yes, when he took us there. DEPUTY JONES: 15 That's when you was with Charlie? 16 MR. THOMAS: Yes. Yes. 17 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: And --18 DEPUTY JONES: Did you all stay in the car or get 19 out or --20 MR. THOMAS: Stayed in the car. He rushed right 21 out. DEPUTY JONES: Was the car in the garage at that 22 23 time? 2.4 MR. THOMAS: I -- I -- I ain't planned on taking no 25 car in the garage. But he rushed out and went -- and

went in the house, and when he come back, he went to a little shelf up there and he got a box of cartridges, and he told Charlie that -- like, Charlie, load the gun. You want to load one of these guns? He got a big old brown bag in between me and him about this high.

So that's all I know. That's all I got to say. I don't have nothing against the man. I don't know nothing about it. The man didn't never did nothing to me. I don't know nothing about it. That's right.

That's the only thing I can say is that.

DEPUTY JONES: Did you go (inaudible) any things that -- that particular night at any point in time that made you felt like that maybe this man wasn't who he said he was or could possibly be somebody else, or do you feel 100 percent certain that who you were talking to was who he was?

MR. THOMAS: That's the only thing I can go by.

DEPUTY JONES: What you were told?

MR. THOMAS: Yeah. I -- I don't know --

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Oh, I have a question.

MR. THOMAS: Yeah.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: I have a really interesting -this is what I would love to know. Did you see the guy
earlier sharpening any tools anywhere?

MR. THOMAS: No. No. No.

DEPUTY JONES: When you work in the field, do you 1 2 have -- did you all have a guy that come around and like sharpen knives or blades or anybody like that that would 3 come to the fields and do it for the work? 4 5 MR. THOMAS: No, nothing I can think of. 6 DEPUTY JONES: Working in the fields, did you ever know a white man, his nickname was Slim, they just 8 called him Slim, and he was kind of a tall guy? MR. THOMAS: No. 9 10 DEPUTY JONES: That don't ring no bell? 11 MR. THOMAS: Because I -- I was working with most 12 of the -- most of the way -- most of the big crews that's coming out of Orlando coming through --13 14 DEPUTY JONES: They was all coming in that time for the season to work? 15 16 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: So what did you mean when you 17 said the guy was acting kind of funny that day when you 18 were sharpening the tools and that's what made you know 19 that something was up and that's why you got out of the car and left? 20 21 MR. THOMAS: I don't know nothing about sharpening 22 no tools. 23 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: I mean, I'm just saying that 2.4 you had said that, so I was wondering --25 MR. THOMAS: No, I didn't. I never told nobody that

in my whole life.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: But, I mean, like in the court. Like in the court you were saying that -- that when you were in the car, that after Charlie went in the store and the guy told you to get back in the car, you thought to yourself, I don't know about this situation. And then you had said --

MR. THOMAS: Not when they got -- when they got out the car and went to the store in there, he opened the door, said, Come on, Charlie. He said, Come on you all.

So I got out the car. I said, I'm not going in that store because it's dark in there. I'm not going in that store.

He said, Well, if you ain't going to the store, you get back in the car and sit down.

And when they went up to that store, I got right out, went across the street over there. They had just had built a new grocery store called Food World right next to Kentucky Fried Chicken. And I saw some guy from Oakland over there, a (inaudible) guy named Sam.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Uh-huh.

(Multiple people speaking at once.)

MR. THOMAS: I saw him from Oakland. And I told him like, Man, them people over there acting like a clown, man. I ain't messing around over there with them

And I went on down -- I walked on down 14 the line. So I come into a little --INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Was there one other guy with 15 16 you that you picked up that was at the store that was 17 kind of high? 18 MR. THOMAS: No. 19 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Oh, okay. 20 MR. THOMAS: No. No. 21 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Okay. Go ahead. Sorry. 22 MR. THOMAS: So, I gotta -- I kind of walked on down 23 the street and walked on down Highway 50 further down. 24 I might have walked about a half a mile down, and there 25 was little restrooms over there. And I seen the police

also over there. And I went over there and I told him. 1 He said he ain't heard nothing about it on the scanner. 2 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: He said what? 3 MR. THOMAS: He said he hasn't heard anything about 4 5 it. 6 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Oh, okay. 7 MR. THOMAS: I told him what was going on. He said, 8 I haven't heard anything about it. He said, Let me check. 9 He got on the scanner, and he said, Yes, they want 10 11 you back over there right now. 12 And he carried me back to the store. And that's the 13 first time I ever been in the store. And all the people 14 was in the store, the detectives and everybody was in the store. 15 16 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Why would the whole 17 neighborhood where you lived be surrounded with police 18 when the murders happened? Do you know? I mean, did 19 you wonder? 20 MR. THOMAS: I don't know. Because he -- they --21 they know -- I don't know how they knew, but they know I 22 was with Charlie. They knew I was with him. 23 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: So they were looking for you 2.4 when they were surrounding your neighborhood do you 25 think?

MR. THOMAS: I was with Charlie so they -- yeah. 1 2 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Yeah. What about Johnny 3 Thornton (phonetic)? That was sad. MR. THOMAS: Who is Johnny Thornton? 4 5 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Johnny Thornton, the guy that 6 was -- who was also a picker from Hilton. He came down 7 and he would stay over there at the Winter Garden Inn. 8 MR. THOMAS: I don't know no Johnny Thornton. 9 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Oh, I thought you -- I thought 10 you knew him. 11 MR. THOMAS: I don't know a Johnny Thornton. 12 don't know him. I don't know him. I know a Jamaica 13 guy, Coke, back from the store right there. Me and him 14 go up the road together, me and his -- me and him and 15 his family. We go up the road together. That time he 16 went up there he stayed up there. He went to Rochester 17 and he stayed, him and his family both. 18 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Did they? 19 MR. THOMAS: These people put him up in a place. 20 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: That's good. 21 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. 22 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: What about Robert Foster? 23 MR. THOMAS: I don't know Robert Foster. 2.4 Calvin brung up something about Robert Foster. I don't 25 even know him.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Well, I only ask you because his name was in the paper every day after the murders -MR. THOMAS: Yeah.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: -- as one of the witnesses.

MR. THOMAS: But -- but this guy here, he was telling the paper, everybody was talking about it. He said that Jamaica say he went up there, say he was his handyman. Said he went up there and said he drove around, and said when he drove around to the back of the store, it's a big fence back there, gate, big fence back there. And he said when he drove in the gate, he locked the gate -- locked the gate on it. He locked the gate on it and he went though the back door.

And he said -- he call him in the store, call him to come in the store, and said as he was walking in the store, he heard like something pop, pop, pop. He said, Hell, what you trying to do, kill me with those, Mr. Zeigler? And he said he jumped out and ran and got back over the fence. I don't know nothing about that spot neither. That's just what they had in the paper.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: But did you -- did you hear him say Mr. Zeigler or did -- are you aware of the fact that --

MR. THOMAS: I -- I -- I don't know nothing they said. I wasn't there at that time.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Because you were at the trial. 1 And they obviously kept saying that the person had --2 3 that it was a white man. 4 MR. THOMAS: I wasn't in there when the people 5 was --6 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Oh, okay. Right. 7 MR. THOMAS: When -- when they was testifying. 8 was outside so I could not hear nothing, and then they call me in. 9 10 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Okay. 11 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. 12 DEPUTY JONES: Yeah. They bring you all in one at a 13 time, and then when you got through testifying you go back in --14 15 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. You don't -- you don't never 16 hear other man -- what the other man testifying about 17 because it's all over; they put stuff in the paper, you 18 know, what --19 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Well, why would you be -- so 20 why would every -- why are you afraid like right now and 21 who are you afraid of? If you've -- if -- if the 22 right guy's in there -- in the prison all -- in a cage 23 for 37 or 8 years, why -- what -- what's the problem? 24 You know what I mean? Like, why --25 MR. THOMAS: Don't you know that's that Klan area

THOMAS: -- Winter Garden -- I heard about 20 Winter Garden and all of them places, Winter Garden, 21 Ocoee. You can't even hardly go to the store at night 22 in Ocoee. Ocoee is right down the road, and that's -they had a store that stayed open all night called 23 2.4 Beauregards down there in Ocoee, and people could go 25 down there, and they have -- they have problem with --

the black people have a problem with white peoples down 1 2 there. When you and Charlie first went to 3 DEPUTY JONES: the store, just you and him the first time, there was 4 5 nobody in the store? 6 MR. THOMAS: When we first went to the store, the 7 store was dark. The store was dark. 8 DEPUTY JONES: No lights on at all? 9 MR. THOMAS: There wasn't nothing there. We parked 10 on the side. 11 DEPUTY JONES: No cars out front? 12 MR. THOMAS: No cars. No nothing there. When we got back, there was nothing there but just his van. 13 14 And then he says, The man supposed to be here so I can get my TV for my old lady. He was going to get a TV 15 16 for his old -- get his old lady a TV for a Christmas 17 present. 18 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Uh-huh. DEPUTY JONES: Was it dark at this time or still 19 20 kind of light? 21 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, it -- yeah, it was dark. It was 22 dark at that time. 23 DEPUTY JONES: Do you know about what time of night 2.4 that was? 25 MR. THOMAS: No, I don't. It wasn't -- it wasn't

late late, though. I don't know the time. Back then 1 2 time was getting dark pretty early. DEPUTY JONES: Back then it probably would have been 3 dark between -- probably between 6:30 and 7. 4 5 MR. THOMAS: Seven o'clock, yeah. Something like 6 along in there, yeah. 7 DEPUTY JONES: You think it was somewhere in the 8 neighborhood of 7 when you and Charlie went to the store 9 to get the TV? 10 MR. THOMAS: Uh, I can't -- I can't put my --11 pinpoint exactly what time it was, but it wasn't late, though. I know that. 12 13 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Like what do you call late? 14 DEPUTY JONES: No cars -- there was no cars? MR. THOMAS: It wasn't -- it wasn't 10 o'clock. 15 16 wasn't up in that area. 17 DEPUTY JONES: Right. So at that time there was no 18 cars at the store, period? 19 MR. THOMAS: There was no cars at the store. 20 lights at the store either. 21 DEPUTY JONES: And then you all pulled to the back? 22 MR. THOMAS: No, we ain't pull in no back. 23 DEPUTY JONES: Yeah. I mean, not right behind the 2.4 store, but like parked right around from the store or 25 something?

MR. THOMAS: No, we parked right in the front of the 1 2 store on the side there. Right on the side. Not side of the building, but in front of the building. 3 parked in front of the building right here. 4 5 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: What car was in front of the 6 building besides yours? 7 MR. THOMAS: Wasn't no car in front of no building. 8 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: No cars? MR. THOMAS: No. 9 10 DEPUTY JONES: Okay. Then that's where you all are 11 sitting when the -- the guy pulled up to talk to you 12 all? 13 MR. THOMAS: He pulled right up said, Come on, 14 Charlie, get in here. He said, Who you got there? Не said, Who is that in the car there? 15 16 He says, That's Tom. He come help me get a TV. 17 He said, Get in the car for a minute. You all going 18 to ride with me a minute. 19 So I get in the car and this guy here --20 DEPUTY JONES: That's when you all rode out to, what 21 was it, orange groves? 22 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. That's where we're going. 23 That's where he -- he get -- carried us then. 2.4 He said, Who's that Charlie? 25 He said, Tom.

He said, Come on. Get in. 1 2 Well, I got in the front seat. Charlie got in -- in 3 the back seat on right back of him. He got in back the driver, and I got in the front seat. And he went out --4 5 from the store he went straight across by Kentucky Fried 6 Chicken, straight across Highway 50, and he went down 7 the road about -- I guess about two miles, and he -- and 8 he turn around. He turn around and head back this way. He said, Look, Charlie, I got some pistols here and 9 10 I want to see if they accurate. He said, You want to try one? He fired out the window three or four times, 11 12 pow, pow, pow. DEPUTY JONES: Now, that was Charlie or the other 13 14 quy? 15 MR. THOMAS: Both of them. He give Charlie a pistol 16 to shoot too. And he asked me, he said, Do you want to 17 shoot? He said, you want to try, Tom? 18 I said, No, I don't know about no guns or nothing. 19 And he took off. 20 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: So you didn't fire guns? 21 MR. THOMAS: No, no, no. 22 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: You did not fire the guns?

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Tell me about this guy's

Okay. 15 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Did he smoke cigarettes? 16 MR. THOMAS: He wasn't smoking? 17 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: No smoking? MR. THOMAS: No, he wasn't smoking. 18 19 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Seriously, how many times did 20 he spit? Like he's talking to you, and just, like, 21 pretend you're him. 22 MR. THOMAS: He just (spit sound) had went (spit 23 sound) like someone making him sick. 2.4 TNVESTIGATOR CARTY: Ah. Huh. And how was his 25 hair? What does his hair look like?

MR. THOMAS: I don't know what his hair look like. 1 His hair -- he -- he didn't have on -- he didn't have on 2 3 no cap or nothing, though. He had glasses on. INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Yeah. 4 That's what I want to 5 know. 6 MR. THOMAS: He had a -- he had a pair of glasses 7 on. And I wasn't paying that much attention. He had 8 on -- I know he had to have glasses on because I looked 9 up, he had glasses and he started spitting. 10 DEPUTY JONES: When you all left, where did you go 11 then? 12 MR. THOMAS: When we finally left -- okay. when he came back from out there shooting, we went back 13 to the store again. 14 DEPUTY JONES: Was there a car there this time? 15 16 MR. THOMAS: No. I ain't see no car. 17 Went back to the store, and he said, Come on, 18 Charlie. Come on. I ain't my key. He said, I know how to get in. 19 20 So, he went right out there to the side of the 21 store, and there's a fence around there, and he climbed 22 over that fence. THOMAS: Yeah. And so I was. 6 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Yeah, really. That's a --7 that's a red flag. 8 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. THOMAS: They passed that and they went around 22 til he come to the -- went down the road a little bit 23 then turn to the -- to the right, and then he passed a little -- passed a place, looked like it was -- should 24

have been some kind of factory or a warehouse or -- a

building or somewhere people worked at. And then we 1 went up there and made a -- made a left, and then made 2 3 another right, right up in the garage there. INVESTIGATOR CARTY: And -- wait. 4 Wait. He pulled 5 up into the garage? 6 MR. THOMAS: He pulled right up to the edge of the 7 garage like this. 8 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Inside the garbage? 9 MR. This time when he got to the store, he went -- we went 1 2 on the right-hand side and come back around on this -on this side where the big box -- switch box is. 3 He said, Tom, hit that -- hit that switch button. 4 5 I hit --6 DEPUTY JONES: What was the reason for that? 7 MR. THOMAS: You have to ask him that. I don't 8 know. And I was thinking about that all the time. 9 DEPUTY JONES: Was the switch up and you let it 10 down? 11 MR. THOMAS: I pulled the switch down like this. 12 DEPUTY JONES: It wasn't already down? 13 MR. THOMAS: No. He said, Hit that switch. Pull 14 that switch down. 15 I pulled it down. Back in front of the store again. 16 He got out. 17 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: In front? 18 MR. THOMAS: He got out in front, right in front of 19 the store. 20 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Uh-huh. 21 MR. THOMAS: Okay. We was parked -- he was parked 22 on the left-hand side of the front of the store. 23 more on the right. I'm more on the right in front of 2.4 the store than what they was. They was sitting on --25 off to the side because he got out and unlocked the

door. 1 He said, Come on, Charlie. 2 He was standing in the door. And when Charlie 3 walked in, he said, Come on, Tom. 4 5 I said, No, I'm not going in there, man. It's dark 6 in there. I'm not going in that store. I said, You cut 7 some lights on, I'll come in there. 8 He said, You ain't going -- he said, You ain't going in, so you get back in the car and sit down. 9 10 And when he got back in the car, when they hit that 11 door, I jumped out -- I jumped out of the car and hauled 12 ass across the street. 13 DEPUTY JONES: Now, all this happened and there 14 wasn't an expanded time frame in there? It all happened just like that? 15 16 MR. THOMAS: He was a quick check (phonetic) man. 17 He -- he was -- he was just -- he was just ready. He --18 he -- he was in a hurry -- or whoever you all say he is, 19 he was in a hurry.

INVESTIGATOR CARTY: And they brought it with them and they wanted Tommy to be the executor. So his brother-in-law was not happy.

And his brother-in-law, this guy, he was a warden in Moultrie, Georgia at the time. It says right here. It's a whole story all about how he's a prison warden in Moultrie, Georgia, playing softball on the nights of the trial when he gets home, and he was going to lose his whole inheritance and he was not happy.

I have papers where he beat his whole family. Okay? This is all about him. He came home in a stupor and he threatened to kill his family. He threatened to kill -- he punched his pregnant daughter in the face. And this guy, the brother-in-law, he got \$3 million from the will, from these -- these murders, 3 million. He did not want to lose his inheritance.

And these are his parents. And they had this will in the courthouse up in Colquitt since August of '67, and they were changing it, and they asked Tommy Zeigler to be the executor. So they wanted to take their son, the jail warden, off of there because all he did was drunk and ravel rouse, and that's the truth, and that's what we found out to be true.

And his daughter-in-law, guess what, the ring that 1 was missing from Tommy's wife's hand --2 Uh-huh. 3 MR. THOMAS: INVESTIGATOR CARTY: -- she knows exactly where it 4 5 It's in Moultrie, Georgia in a safety deposit box is. 6 at the Colony Bank. MR. THOMAS: Ha, ha, ha . . . 8 And her -- this is her grandfather Perry, Jr., Tommy's brother-in-law. And right now he is having his 9 10 lungs rejected. He had a lung transplant, and right at 11 this very moment he's in the hospital, in Shands 12 teaching hospital in Jacksonville -- I'm sorry, Mayo 13 Clinic. And this is the guy that punched his pregnant 14 daughter in the face, got \$3 million --Ha, ha, ha . . . 15 MR. THOMAS: 16 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: -- and was very upset because 17 his parents were going to take him off the will and make 18 Tommy the executor because he was a good businessman. 19 So this guy ended up getting like a Hummer, you 20 know, \$3 million. 21 MR. THOMAS: Uh-huh. 22 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: And he was a tyrant. His whole 23 family's petrified to come forward, but they came 2.4 forward and told the truth. And that's his 25 daughter-in-law.

And this guy said to his son, chased him down and said, Boy, I'm going to put you in jail. I'm going to see that you never get out. I'm an Edwards. I've been known to do it before and I can do it again, and you'll never see the light of day.

MR. THOMAS: Well, see, I don't know nothing about that, none of that as far as that. The only thing I know about is what -- I was with Charlie and what happened with him. I don't know nothing else.

THOMAS: That's right. 11 DEPUTY JONES: And the way I want to ask this is in 12 this fashion. MR. THOMAS: Uh-huh. 13 14 DEPUTY JONES: Was that -- I mean, I'm sure you'd already saw --15 16 MR. THOMAS: Uh-huh. 17 DEPUTY JONES: -- photographs in the paper, news 18 articles that had been out about it, you know, maybe the news or the paper were covered with it to show people 19 20 what happened. 21 MR. THOMAS: No. Actually -- actually, I really 22 don't read too good anyway. So I don't -- I don't --23 DEPUTY JONES: What -- what I'm -- what I'm getting 24 at is this, because I've seen this being in law 25 enforcement all my life.

MR. THOMAS: Uh-huh. Uh-huh. 1 Like you said, you didn't know a lot 2 DEPUTY JONES: of these people. You didn't know them back them. 3 4 MR. THOMAS: That's right. You knew Charlie. That's basically 5 DEPUTY JONES: 6 about the only person you knew. 7 MR. THOMAS: I know Charlie, yeah. 8 DEPUTY JONES: So you had to go based on what this man told you, right? Just like if he were to tell me 9 10 that so and so were together and I never saw them, then 11 I got to go with what he tells me. Yeah . 12 MR. THOMAS: 13 DEPUTY JONES: So you were testifying -- had you 14 ever been in court prior to this for anything? MR. THOMAS: Uh --15 16 DEPUTY JONES: The way I'm asking this, the man 17 who's sitting in that particular chair when you were 18 sent in, when you went up there and testified that this 19 is the guilty party because --20 MR. THOMAS: No. No. I ain't -- I ain't never 21 testified against nobody. 22 DEPUTY JONES: You was able to look at him and say 23 that's who I was with that night? 2.4 MR. THOMAS: Yeah, because, remember, I had left. 25 was -- that's the man right there with them glasses on.

They asked me to point the man out. That's the man with 1 2 the glasses on right there. DEPUTY JONES: You could recognize him by glasses or 3 facial features or -- I mean, what recollect --4 5 MR. THOMAS: Yeah. Yeah. He -- he was 6 pretty -- he was pretty tall there. I don't know. 7 should have been about pretty close to six feet or 8 something about like that. Yeah, he was pretty tall and 9 thin just like the guy was in the car. So that's the 10 only man I know right there. 11 So, you know, I'm really sorry I can't help you out 12 with no more that I -- I know, but that's all I know. INVESTIGATOR CARTY: In the parking lot you saw him 13 14 too? Yeah, I saw him. MR. THOMAS: 15 16 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: In the parking lot before you 17 guys walked in you were with Frye? 18 MR. THOMAS: But we -- I wasn't with no Frye. 19 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Well, who was with you when you 20 walked into the -- you know, when you walked into the 21 courthouse somebody was with you. MR. THOMAS: I didn't walk in the courthouse. 22 I was 23 on -- the detectives, they had -- I was like under police protection. 24 25 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Yeah.

MR. THOMAS: And detectives, they brung me in there. 1 2 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: That's who Frye is I'm saying. I don't -- I don't even know him, but 3 MR. THOMAS: 4 he was a nice guy. INVESTIGATOR CARTY: A really good friend of mine --5 6 DEPUTY JONES: Do you feel it's safe to say that 7 everything that you and Charlie and that man done that 8 afternoon probably could have happened between 6 and 7 o'clock? Because shortly after 7 I think's when you 9 10 went across the street and caught a ride. 11 MR. THOMAS: Well, he was -- I can tell you this, it 12 wasn't real late. It wasn't real late. It was just 13 dark. I didn't have no reason to keep up with no --14 DEPUTY JONES: It was like the sun was going down 15 when Charlie picked you up? 16 MR. I said, I don't care. 9 10 So I got I the van and went. 11 DEPUTY JONES: And you can remember without a shadow 12 of doubt there was no cars at all in the front of the 13 store other than what you all were riding in? 14 MR. THOMAS: Wasn't nothing. That store was -that -- that store was dark. It looked like midnight. 15 16 That store was dark. Wasn't no lights in that store at 17 all. INVESTIGATOR CARTY: You wouldn't be able to tell if 18 19 there lights in the store if it wasn't dark out 20 probably, right? It would probably have been dark out 21 because you couldn't see. MR. THOMAS: Well, you know, you can't see a light 22 23 against a light that much. 2.4 INVESTIGATOR CARTY: Yeah, that's what I'm saying.
